Amy teaches at Sciences Po Paris and Boston University. She regularly appears in French and international media. She is the author of two books - L'Amérique face à ses fractures (Tallandier, 2024) and L'Amérique Après Obama (Autrement, 2012) - and many publications appearing in revues and the press.
